PREPARE

The Easter Vigil is an ancient Christian tradition celebrated on the Saturday before Easter Sunday. The service begins in darkness and then includes the reading of Old Testament stories of God's salvation.

What you need:

◆ A candle with a drip protector or holder for each person to hold

What to do:

◆ At the beginning of the service, light your candle. When the readings from Scripture begin, extinguish it.

THE SERVICE OF LIGHT

The Lighting of the Paschal Candle

CELEBRANT: Dear friends in Christ: On this most holy night, in which our Lord Jesus passed over from death to life, the Church invites her members, dispersed throughout the world, to gather in vigil and prayer. For this is the Passover of the Lord, in which, by hearing his Word and celebrating his Sacraments, we share in his victory over death.

Let us pray.

O God, through your Son you have bestowed upon your people the brightness of your light: Sanctify this new fire, and grant that in this Paschal feast we may so burn with heavenly desires, that with pure minds we may attain to the festival of everlasting light; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

ALL: Amen.

The Celebrant, with a knife, traces a Cross into the Paschal Candle and then outlines the letters of the Greek alphabet-Alpha and Omega-and says the following words.

CELEBRANT: Christ yesterday and today, The Beginning and the End,

Alpha and Omega

His are all times and all ages to Him be glory and dominion through all ages of eternity.

ALL: Amen.

The Celebrant places the five incense buds into the candle, representing the five wounds of Christ.

CELEBRANT: By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard and keep us.

ALL: Amen.


The Celebrant lights the Paschal Candle with the new fire.

CELEBRANT: May the light of Christ, rising in glory, banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

ALL: Amen.

All remain standing for the Proclamation of the Resurrection which is sung by the Cantor.


The Exsultet: The Easter Proclamation

CANTOR: Rejoice now, heavenly hosts and choirs of angels, and let your trumpets shout Salvation for the victory of our mighty King.

Rejoice and sing now, all the round earth, bright with a glorious splendor, for darkness has been vanquished by our eternal King.

Rejoice and be glad now, Mother Church, and let your holy courts, in radiant light, resound with the praises of your people.

All you who stand near this marvelous and holy flame, pray with me to God the Almighty for the grace to sing the worthy praise of this great light; through Jesus Christ his Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.



CANTOR: It is truly right and good, always and everywhere, with our whole heart and mind and voice, to praise you, the invisible, almighty, and eternal God, and your only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ our Lord: for he is the true Paschal Lamb, who at the feast of the Passover paid for us the debt of Adam's sin, and by his blood delivered your faithful people.

This is the night, when you brought our fathers, the children of Israel, out of bondage in Egypt, and led them through the Red Sea on dry land.

This is the night, when all who believe in Christ are delivered from the gloom of sin, and are restored to grace and holiness of life.


This is the night, when Christ broke the bonds of death and hell, and rose victorious from the grave.

How wonderful and beyond our knowing, O God, is your mercy and loving-kindness to us, that to redeem a slave, you gave a Son.

How holy is this night, when wickedness is put to flight, and sin is washed away. It restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to those who mourn. It casts out pride and hatred, and brings peace and concord.

How blessed is this night, when earth and heaven are joined and man is reconciled to God.




