The Sermon

Spirit-Filled Witnesses

Jn. 14:15-17, 25-27

If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask *the Father* and he will give you another *Helper*, to be with you forever, even the *Spirit of truth*, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you.

These things I have spoken to you while I am still with you.
But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name,

he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you.

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid.

Jn. 15:26-27

But when the *Helper* comes, whom I will send to you from *the Father*, the *Spirit of truth*, who proceeds from *the Father*,

he will bear witness about me. And you also will bear witness, because you have been with me from the beginning.

Jn. 16:7, 13-14

Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, *the Helper* will not come to you...

When the *Spirit of truth* comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come.

He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you.
