SERMON SERIES | SUMMER 2021

Join us for our 19-week sermon series on the New Testament Acts of the Apostles-or perhaps more accurately, “The continuing acts and teaching of Jesus and the Spirit through his Church.” The story starts modestly as the followers of Jesus, a mere 120 people, gather for prayer in an upper room (see Acts 1:13). Then, based on Jesus’ call to be witnesses of his resurrection, they spread out in bold and creative mission first in Jerusalem and then “to the ends of the earth” (1:8).

The book features the gripping account of the Church’s key leaders (also called “the apostles”), but it also covers the stories of dozens of Christians who hold ordinary jobs serving Jesus and his Church. We’ll discover how the Church did not develop into a global movement, but has always lived and breathed as a global movement. And we’ll learn how the power of the Spirit equips us to let the good news of the resurrection flow out of our lives.
